

Predictive Thresholds

Admins can now select a threshold as a percentage above normal activity levels.


- New AI advancements compare current user activity to average activity, in real time, to determine when thresholds are crossed.
- Thresholds are now dynamic instead of static. As user behavior changes, thresholds adapt to those changes.





Predictive Thresholds

Instead of trying to determine what static thresholds should be, you simply decide what your level of comfort is for users to exceed their normal activity levels. You decide what percentage to apply to each threshold.



Guardian's Activity Graph shows the historic activity levels for selected activities, and then displays the thresholds based upon the percentages that were selected for each activity.



Predictive Thresholds


Configure Guardian for your enterprise much quicker with the ability to create

multiple rules at once.

 Set the parameters for the rules.

 Select the activities to be covered.

Add the rule.



Now a rule has been created for all of the selected activities.



New Threshold and Notification Options

Guardian now offers three thresholds instead of two, with email address notification customizations available at each level. This allows more leeway for user behavior before disabling an account.

First Threshold:

- User activity 50% higher than normal (most common alert).
- Notifications sent to an admin.

Second Threshold:

- User activity 100%
 higher than normal
 (less-frequent alert, may indicate wrongdoing).
- Notifications sent to department head. Account is temporarily disabled, pending review.

Third Threshold:

- User activity 150% higher than normal (infrequent alert, but likely requires immediate attention and temporary disabling of the user's account)
- Notifications sent to security and/or IT personnel. Account is temporarily disabled, pending review.



Exclusions

Temporary exclusions from Guardian rules can now be established for users and/or groups. This allows users to work uninterrupted on special projects that fall outside normal workloads.

For example: If a user is performing discovery for a court case, that user's account can be excluded during those tasks as not to trigger false alerts or temporary account disabling.



Meta Data Rules


Rules can now be created based upon meta data, such as client, matter, and/or document type.

This way, if there is a particularly sensitive matter (contracts, personal data, financial information, etc.), lower thresholds can be established by meta data to ensure anyone accessing those documents is doing so appropriately.




Customize Notification Text

Use the Guardian template to create custom notification messages.




With the opportunity to include specific instructions to different users, there's less ambiguity over what action should be taken when a notification is received.





Additional Email Options

- Use the existing SQL mail option for sending notifications or designate an SMTP server.
- There is also a new feature that sends test messages to aid in the configuration and setup of Guardian.





Rules for Secured Items vs. All Items

Not all documents in your repository may need to be monitored by Guardian.

To reduce the number of false alarms generated, users can now select whether a rule covers all items in your repository or only those that have security applied.
